
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
How can drug expertise impact the opioid crisis?





Prescribing

- Collaborative practice/standing orders
- Multimodal drug use
- Right drug, right quantity, right duration
 - Rx control
- Align with available data
 - Research patterns and fill in the gaps!



Dispensing


- Appropriate packaging
- Limit diversion
 - Accountability for all points in chain of command
 - Monitoring and surveillance programs
- Be critical, ask questions



Education

- Patient education
- Provider education
 - Comparative prescribing
 - Machine learning

Assessment/Continuation

- Traditional pharmacist and technician roles assuring appropriate goals & plan



Discontinuation

- Disposal options
