Buses are leaving from all the schools except for Chicago State. Expect to have an impact. Working on four different bills: Birth Control Bill for pharmacists prescribing, hospitals to report all controlled substances administered to the IL-PMP, PBM and Managed Care</p> <p>Brooke Griffin: Regarding oral contraception bill, there are screening questions for pharmacists to address when a patient comes in for a prescription – pharmacists are trying to remove these to avoid legislation changes if guidelines change. The birth control ring was not wanted to be added to the bill based on safety with blood clots. Some representatives thought there should not be reimbursement for this service, but other representatives did think there should be reimbursements. Parent supervision for the bill has not come up in conversation recently. Challenges for the bill: will it include pill, patch, and ring or just the pill and then reimbursement.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hot Topic Discussion– Mary Ann Kliethermes Pharmacy quality alliance: healthcare payers going towards quality (bill/dispense records), many are medication related measures, promotes pharmacy/pharmacists as responsible for these measures. PQA will be doing more research on this area, colleges are getting involved in this research to see which measures are working well and identifying best practices Insulin adherence is one taskforce coming out. ER admissions due to bleeding ADR from anticoagulants and hypoglycemia due to antidiabetic medications STAR measures, in other states with Medicaid with opioid related measures Reimbursements within clinics – struggle and we need to determine our standard and credentialing guidelines for a commercial payers to get reimbursed • Article Discussion (Feldman J, et al. A community pharmacist – led service to facilitate care transitions and reduce hospital readmissions) Conducted in Midwest partnered with community pharmacies to see if patient outcomes improved.
